
Krishnagar Women's College, established in 1958, was founded to address the educational needs of women, particularly those migrating from erstwhile East Pakistan, in the aftermath of India's independence. This institution began its journey within Krishnagar Government College before moving to an old building on Basanta Chatterjee Lane. Under the visionary leadership of its first Principal, Professor Dipti Bose, and with financial support from the West Bengal Government, the current college campus was constructed. Over the years, the college has consistently strived to provide quality education, especially to first-generation learners from marginalized communities. Initially affiliated with Calcutta University, the college came under the jurisdiction of Kalyani University in 2000. It has been accredited by NAAC, earning a B++ grade in its first cycle and a B+ in its second. Spanning 3.9 acres in the heart of Krishnagar, the eco-friendly campus boasts numerous facilities, including a medicinal plant garden, well-equipped science laboratories, an automated library with e-journals and OPAC access, ICT-enabled classrooms, a computer lab, a gymnasium, and sports infrastructure. Students benefit from amenities like a hygienic canteen, pure drinking water, a cycle stand, and facilities for differently-abled individuals. The clean and secure on-campus hostel, with affordable rates and dedicated staff, is particularly advantageous for students from distant areas.

The institution takes pride in its robust academic structure, offering Honours courses in ten undergraduate disciplines across Science, Literature, and Social Sciences. Regular classes are enriched with special lectures by eminent faculty and inter-departmental collaborations. Students are also encouraged to participate in study tours, seminars, workshops, and add-on certificate courses, all of which contribute to their academic excellence. Many students achieve commendable results in university exams, often securing top marks in their subjects.

The college library houses over 27,000 books and offers access to 6,293 e-journals and 195,809 e-books through the UGC-INFLIBNET N-LIST program. Automated using the KOHA software, it provides an excellent resource for academic growth. Additionally, the college facilitates scholarships like Kanyashree, Aikyashree, and Swami Vivekananda Merit-cum-Means, ensuring that students from disadvantaged backgrounds receive financial support.

The Career Counselling and Placement Cell empower students by organizing free training programs to enhance their communication and ICT skills. In collaboration with Webel, a diploma course in computer applications is conducted on campus. Partnerships with organizations such as Student Health Home and Kanyashree University further enrich the college's offerings. The college also provides a certificate course in computers, an online job portal, and short-term vocational training programs to enhance students' employability.

Beyond academics, the college encourages holistic development through co-curricular and extension activities. Students actively participate in cultural programs, observance of significant national and international days, and the publication of departmental wall magazines and the annual college magazine, which provides them a platform to showcase their creative talents. These achievements are celebrated annually during the Prize Distribution Ceremony, fostering a sense of accomplishment and community among students led by its Governing Body, chaired by the distinguished academician Sri Siddhartha Majumder, and its dedicated Principal, Dr. Natasa Dasgupta, the college remains steadfast in its mission to provide inclusive, quality education and promote the all-around development of its students.

Admission Qualifications:

A candidate may be admitted to the first semester of 4year (8semesters) UG courses of studies On passing Higher Secondary (10+2) Examination in general conducted by the West Bengal Council of Higher Secondary Education or an equivalent examination conducted by Other State Board/ Council or the West Bengal Council of Rabindra Open Schooling or National Institute of Open Schooling (NIOS) recognized by the Distant Education Bureau (DBE), **Subject to fulfilment of the conditions mentioned below:**

In case of other Boards/ Councils a candidate shall have to pass in five recognized Subjects, of which one shall be English, of full marks not being less than 100 each.

A candidate passing in less than five subjects shall not be eligible for admission. However, candidates passing Higher Secondary examination in vocational stream conducted By the West Bengal State Council of Technical & Vocational Education and Skill Development (WBSCTVE & SD) or any other equivalent Board/ Council are also eligible for admission Provided that the candidate must have passed in five recognized subjects of which one shall be English. Candidates shall be allowed for admission within 03 (three) consecutive academic sessions Including the year of passing in previous qualifying examination.(For example candidates Passing H.S. Examination in the year 2021 will get last chance of admission in the academic Session 2023-24.)








CO-CURRICULAR AND EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES:



 - e) Apart from these, need and meritorious students who are not financially well sounded are assisted to apply for the financial grant from The Hon'ble Chief Minister's Relief Fund.
 - f) Students are also assisted to avail scholarship provided from NSP, Priyangbada Devi Birla Memorial fund, Department of Armed Forces (only to

Anti-Ragging Measures:

RAGGING:

Ragging, in any form, is totally prohibited in the College premises of Krishnagar Women's College. Any student indulging in such insolent acts shall be subjected to punishment by the concerned authorities and / or a Court of Law.

WHAT IS RAGGING? “Ragging” means causing, inducing, compelling and/or forcing Student, whether by way of a practical joke or otherwise, to do any act which detracts from human dignity, or violates her person, or to expose her to ridicule, or to forebear from do in any lawful act, by intimidating, wrongfully restraining, wrongfully confining, or injuring her, or by using criminal force upon her, or by holding out to her any threat of such intimidation, wrongful restraint, wrongful confinement, injury, or the use of criminal force.

SUPREME COURT VERDICT FOR STRINGENT ACTION IN CASE OF RAGGING:

The Honourable Supreme Court of India in its recent direction to the educational institutions pronounced that all educational institutions should obtain an UNDERTAKING from each candidate at the time of admission to the effect that, he/she is aware of the system of punishment in case of ragging to other students. And that, in case he/she is involved in any case of ragging, he / she is aware of the scale of punishments, including criminal action, cancellation of admission, expulsion from hostel, withdrawal of scholarship, imposition of fine up to Rs.

25,000/-, and / or rigorous imprisonment up to 3 (three) years, etc. All candidates and their parents / guardians, in their own interest, are advised to make themselves acquainted with the relevant rules, regulations, provisions of law, as well as decisions of various Courts of Law, including those of the Apex Court, in relation to anti-ragging measures in India.

IT IS MANDATORY FOR ALL STUDENTS TO SIGN THE FOLLOWING UNDERTAKING WHICH IS TO BE ENDORSED BY THEIR GUARDIANS:

That, I am aware of the system of punishment in case of ragging to other student(s) and that in case I am found to be involved in any case of ragging, in any form whatsoever, I am liable for any punishment, including, but not limited to, the following :- a) Cancellation of admission; b) Suspension from attending classes; c) Withholding / Withdrawing Scholarship / Fellowship and/or any other benefits; d) Debarring from appearing for any test / examination and/or other evaluation process; e) Withholding results of any test / examination; f) Debarring from representing the College in any campus interview; g) Debarring from representing the College from attending / participating in any national or international meet / tournament / youth festival, etc.; h) Suspension / expulsion from the hostel; i) Rustication from the College for such period as may be decided by concerned authorities; j) Expulsion from the College and consequent debarring from admission to any other educational institution, for such period as may be decided by concerned authorities; k) Imposition of fine up to Rs.25,000/- (Rupees Twenty-Five Thousand) Rigorous imprisonment up to 3(three) years(by a Court of Law), etc. 2. That, I, hereby, declare that, I am aware of the Supreme Court of India directive, as well as the prevalent laws / rules, etc., on anti- ragging, prescribed by Govt. of India, State of West Bengal and the College authorities.

1. That, I, further declare that, I fully understand the meaning of 'Ragging' and know that ragging in any form is a punishable offence and the same is banned by the Laws of the land. 4. That, I also understand that, in case I am involved in ragging, the case will be reported to the police and the law will take its own course

Redressal of Grievances of Students:

These regulations shall be called as the University Grants Commission (Redressal of Grievances of Students) Regulations, 2023.

Objective:

To provide opportunities for redressal of certain grievances of students already enrolled in any institution, as well as those seeking admission to such institutions, and a mechanism thereto.

Scope of Grievance can make by Students:

“Grievance” means, and includes, complaint(s) made by an aggrieved student in respect of the following, namely:

- i. Admission contrary to merit determined in accordance with the declared admission policy of the institution;
- ii. Irregularity in the process under the declared admission policy of the institution;
- iii. refusal to admit in accordance with the declared admission policy of the institution;
- iv. non-publication of a prospectus by the institution, in accordance with the provisions of these regulations;
- v. publication by the institution of any information in the prospectus, which is false or misleading, and not based on facts;

- vi. withholding of, or refusal to return, any document in the form of certificates of degree, diploma or any other award or other document deposited by a student for the purpose of seeking admission in such institution, with a view to induce or compel such student to pay any fee or fees in respect of any course or program of study which such student does not intend to pursue;
- vii. demand of money in excess of that specified to be charged in the declared admission policy of the institution;
- viii. violation, by the institution, of any law for the time being in force in regard to reservation of seats in admission to different category of students;
- ix. non-payment or delay in payment of scholarships or financial aid admissible to any student under the declared admission policy of such institution, or under the conditions, if any, prescribed by the Commission;
- x. delay by the institution in the conduct of examinations, or declaration of results, beyond the schedule specified in the academic calendar of the institution,
or in such calendar prescribed by the Commission;
- xi. failure by the institution to provide student amenities as set out in the prospectus, or is required to be extended by the institution under any provisions of law for the time being in force;
- xii. non-transparent or unfair practices adopted by the institution for the evaluation of students;
- xiii. delay in, or denial of, the refund of fees due to a student who withdraws admission within the time mentioned in the prospectus, subject to guidelines, if any, issued by the Commission, from time to time;
- xiv. complaints of alleged discrimination of students from the Scheduled Castes, the Scheduled Tribes, Other Backward Classes, Women, Minorities or persons with disabilities categories;
- xv. denial of quality education as promised at the time of admission or required to be provided;
- xvi. harassment or victimization of a student, other than cases of harassment, which are to be proceeded against under the penal provisions of any law for the time being in force;
- xvii. any action initiated/taken contrary to the statutes, ordinances, rules, regulations, or guidelines of the institution; and

xviii. any action initiated/taken contrary to the regulations and/or guidelines made/issued by the Commission and/or the regulatory body concerned.

Code of Conduct for Students:

Krishnagar Women's College, being the only College for women in the district, maintains a well-drafted code of conduct that aims to set parameters for academic excellence and fulfilling the stated mission and vision of the institution. It acts as a guide for the stakeholders, the students being one of the most important parts of the institution. Once admitted; the students are to follow the rules and regulations of the institution in order to maintain academic discipline inside the campus as well as outside the campus. They become aware of what is expected of them and the Dos and Don'ts as outlined by the institution.

*Admitted students must abide by the University directive regarding attendance (more than 75%) in classes, failing which they will not be allowed to sit for Semester-end Examination.

* Students must wear their Identity Cards issued by the College authority inside the College. Identity Cards are also required at the time of borrowing books from the library.

*Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited in the College campus as well as in the Hostel. Anti-ragging Guidelines issued by UGC are enforced and it is mandatory that students sign and submit the Anti-Ragging Declaration Form at the beginning of the session. They can report any incident to ragging to the Anti-Ragging Cell of the College.

*Students are not allowed to adopt any unfair means at the time of examination.

* Students are not allowed to loiter in the corridors.

* Use of Cell phones during class lectures and in the examination hall is strictly prohibited.

*Students are expected to follow the College Notice Board as well as the College Website for notices and other academic information.

*Students should stay away from any act of violence that may disrupt the conducive atmosphere of the College. They should take note that the College campus including the Hostel area is under CCTV surveillance.

*Use of caste and religion-based discriminatory and derogatory remarks is an act of humiliation and indignity and it is strictly discouraged.

* Participation in the various cultural and extension activities organized by the College is mandatory for the students.

*It is expected of students that they should maintain a friendly relationship with their fellow students and behave respectfully with the Principal, teachers, librarians and non-teaching employees of the College.



